



THE GOOD SHEPHRD

Jesus says in this passage that no one can "take them out of my hand." When He does so, He uses the same word previously used in reference to the wolf that catches and scatters the sheep (see Jn 10:12). By using this image, Jesus is teaching us that we are safe only when we choose to dwell in the palm of His hand. Consequently, we put ourselves in danger whenever we freely choose to wander away from our Lord's protective presence. God doesn't force us to remain in His care. It is up to us every day to choose to place our lives in God's hands.

It can be consoling for us to think of all the ways in which God needs to care for us. However, it can be unsettling to think of how we need to conform our lives to God's will so as to remain in the Lord's protective care. This passage reminds us that we are not passive recipients of the Lord's protection but are active agents in placing ourselves under His care. We all want to experience divine protection, but we don't always want to do what it takes to guarantee that protection. As we celebrate World Day of Prayer for vocations, let us pray for more vocation to priesthood and consecrated life. Fr. Peter
