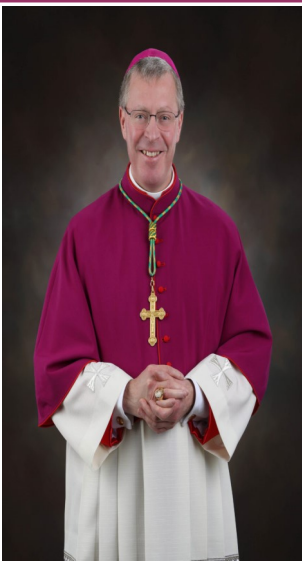


OUR HAPPINESS COMES FROM GOD

We do not displease God by trying to find ways of overcoming pain, illness, poverty, injustice but the beatitudes teach us that the real success of our lives is to love and fulfill God’s will for us. To be righteous means to actively do the will of God even in the midst of a world that is acting contrary to that will. One of the dangers of discipleship is that of complacency, which is the attitude that leads us to say to ourselves that we are “good enough” or that we have “done enough” or that we are “holy enough”. Sometimes such temptations can cause us to excuse ourselves from the challenge of the Gospel and ever-deeper discipleship. When we give in to that temptation, we have stopped “hungering and thirsting” for greater righteousness. We are made in the image and likeness of God and only when we live out that identity perfectly and completely can we claim to be righteous. The problem is that we are often tempted to compare ourselves to others rather than to the example of Jesus. When we do so then we easily settle for just being “better than” someone else rather than being “better for” God. When we keep our crucified and risen Lord as the only standard for comparison in our discipleship, then we realize how far we have yet to go before we can reach the righteousness to which God calls us. While the lived example of our Lord may be a high ideal to live by, it is the daily striving (hungering and thirsting) for it that God desires. Fr. Peter
