LOVE THAT SEEKS RECONCILIATION

We are to be motivated by love that seeks conversion, reconciliation, and growth in holiness rather than by anger or hurt that seeks revenge, punishment, or humiliation. Fraternal correction can be difficult because it risks

misunderstanding, vulnerability, or even aggravating a situation, but it is a part of discipleship. What parent does not manifest their love for their children by helping them correct their faults? What friend doesn't help another friend by wanting to help them become a better person? Fraternal correction is one of the most loving things we can do for another person. It's also something the Lord expects of us. Ezekiel warns us that we are, indeed, the watchmen for our neighbor and that our silence will condemn us if we fail to warn them of the harmful nature of their actions (cf. Ez 3:18; 33:6). Mere knowledge of another's harmful actions imposes on us an obligation to help them. Fr. Peter
