

THE FRUIT OF THE CROSS

We should honor and venerate the cross and carry it, to remind ourselves of the love of God for us and the price Jesus paid for our salvation. The cross will give us strength in our sufferings and remind us of our hope of eternal glory with the risen Lord. With St. Paul, we express our belief that the "message of the cross is foolishness only to those who are perishing" (1Cor 1: 18-24), and that we should "glory in the cross of Our Lord" (Gal 6:14). We bless ourselves with the sign of the cross to remind ourselves that we belong to Christ Jesus and to honor the Most Holy Trinity, asking the Triune God to bless us, save us and protect us. The crucifix reminds us that we are forgiven sinners and, hence, we are expected to forgive those who offend us and ask for forgiveness whenever we offend others
